The Brent Spence Bridge Corridor project is a \$3.6 billion transformation of one of the nation's most vital freight and traffic routes. Spanning eight miles through Ohio and Kentucky, it will ease congestion, improve safety, and reconnect communities.

Key upgrades include a new double-decker companion bridge for interstate traffic, modernization of the existing Brent Spence Bridge, and urban enhancements.

Led by the Walsh-Kokosing Design-Build Team, in collaboration with AECOM and Jacobs, the project supports \$1 billion in daily freight movement and charts a bold path forward for national mobility.
